Considering All Things as Worthless Compared to Christ

"I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done. Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ and become one with him. I no longer count on my own righteousness through obeying the law; rather, I become righteous through faith in Christ. For God's way of making us right with himself depends on faith. I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised him from the dead. I want to suffer with him, sharing in his death, so that one way or another I will experience the resurrection from the dead! I don't mean to say that I have already achieved these things or that I have already reached perfection. But I press on to possess that perfection for which Christ Jesus first possessed me. No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us." Philippians 3:7-14 (NLT)

Paul had invested his entire life in his position as a Pharisee. He believed his adherence to the traditions of the Jewish elders established him as righteous before God. When Jesus appeared to him on the Damascus road, all of his self-righteousness disintegrated. Making matters worse, Paul had devoted substantial time to persecuting anyone who would follow Christ. He just knew that the church had it wrong. He was concerned that their misguided view of God could destroy the true Jewish faith. Imagine his shock as his world came crashing in. Paul's experience must be our own experience.

We must experience the destruction of our self-reliance. We must lose any dependence on our own goodness. We must jettison any hope of earning a righteous standing before God on our own merits. Though none of us may come to faith in the dramatic fashion of Paul - kicked off his horse, blinded, hearing the voice of Christ audibly, we must come to the same place of hopelessness as Paul, abandoning all but Christ.

This personal account of Paul provides a testimony of the doctrine known as justification by faith. "Not having a righteousness of my own..." but instead "a righteousness that comes through faith in the Son of God." We stand just or righteous before God when we believe in His Son. The righteousness of Jesus gets credited to our account. He did all the work and we get all the credit. This verse reminds me of the last stanza of that great hymn, The Solid Rock:

"When He shall come with trumpet sound Oh may I then in Him be found Dressed in His righteousness alone Faultless to stand before the throne."

Looking back on his life, Paul considers everything to be a loss (he compares it to garbage) compared to knowing Christ. It is more than seeing Jesus as infinitely valuable. It is seeing Jesus as so precious that everything else is a total waste. He is supremely glorious, eclipsing all else.

In a world with so many religions, why Jesus?

In addition to an impressive breadth of reading and study, he shares his personal journey from despair and meaninglessness to his discovery that Jesus is who He said He is.


